### A TASTE OF SUNDAY'S SERMON.—REV TIM

Amongst all the hype and reality that is the Corona Virus, we run the risk of being swept into the hype sector of society. Revelation 6:6 declares: *And I heard a voice from among the four living beings say, "A loaf of wheat bread or three loaves of barley will cost a day's pay. And don't waste the olive oil and wine."* Little did they know its almost the same with toilet paper...

But we as Christians have the greatest of comforters. We have God the Father—the author of Grace. God the Son- the sole Saviour, and God the Holy Spirit— the great comforter.

Romans 5:1-11 is about peace and hope. The author explains that gaining that peace is a relational process involving all three members of the Trinity. There is no short cut to salvation as it is bound up in grace, justification, peace and faith.

What's more, when we do reach the most amazing of places, that being saved in Christ, we take on a whole new approach to the ways of the world. Verses 3&4 of our reading from Romans gives us perspective: *Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; 4 perseverance, character; and character, hope.* Ray Stedman puts it like this:

What do we know? Paul says, "Knowing that suffering produces..." Suffering does something, accomplishes something. It is productive. It is of value.

Our world is suffering under COVID-19. We too are at risk of the virus. But we must not let anything take away our faith in Christ. He calmed the Storm. He healed the sick. He raised the dead. He walked on water. He is the Peace giver and the Hope provider. Draw near to him, with faith and thanksgiving.
